



Michael's Thoughts

Greetings to One and All,

The new year is upon us – what shall we do? The lingering reality of Christmas is that we celebrate 'God with us,' good news for all people. The question for entering into 2023 is, "What shall we do with such news." In light of the information I shared last month on the state of the PCUSA, we are to live out the calling on our lives.



On the second Sunday of January, we acknowledge the baptism of Jesus and reflect on what baptism means for us. "The Book of Order" tells us the following factors;

In Baptism, we die to what separates us from God and are raised to newness of life in Christ. Baptism points us back to the grace of God expressed in Jesus Christ, who died for us and who was raised for us. Baptism points us forward to that same Christ who will fulfill God's purpose in God's promised future. Baptism is the sign and symbol of inclusion in God's grace and covenant with the Church. As an identifying mark, Baptism signifies,

the faithfulness of God,
the washing away of sin,
rebirth,
putting on the fresh garment of Christ,
being sealed by God's Spirit,
adoption into the covenant family of the Church,
resurrection and illumination in Christ.

Baptism unites the people of God with each other and with the church of every time and place. Barriers of race, gender, status, and age are to be transcended. Barriers of nationality, history, and practice are to be overcome.

Baptism enacts and seals what the Word proclaims: God's redeeming grace offered to all people. Baptism is God's gift of grace and also God's summons to respond to that grace. Baptism calls to repentance, to faithfulness, and to discipleship. Baptism gives the church its identity and commissions the church for ministry to the world....... Baptism signifies the beginning of life in Christ, not its completion.

As those baptized, we have important work to do. First, the Holy Spirit is calling us to become discerning and mindful of what he is calling us to do; to continue doing what has been placed upon our hearts in this time and in this place called DeLand, FL. TWE must build upon the relationships that we have and stay mindful of the words in the "Letter to the Hebrews:" "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another....."

Remember, as we are out in the world, be sure to look around, breathe deeply upon the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and then breathe out that grace on all you encounter – the world will be a better place for it.

Join with other eager learners in January to explore four important doctrines of the church: Atonement, Resurrection, The Holy Spirit, and Justification.


We'll answer questions such as "Is God against us?", "Who is in charge here?", "What's new?" and, "Are you a Christian?"

Political Asylum Hearing for First Pres members on February 6th

The Ibarra family (Rodolfo, Dayring & Josephine) have been waiting for four years for the hearing that will decide whether they have been granted political asylum in the United States or will be sent back to Nicaragua to face a dire outcome.

After being cancelled twice, the hearing is finally scheduled for February 6th at 8:00 am at the Orlando Immigration Court - Department of Justice. If anyone would like to attend the asylum hearing, wear your First Pres shirt to show support for the Ibarra's. The church bus leave the Church parking lot at 6:00 that morning. 

Year End Finance Information

Important Tax Reduction Opportunity for IRA owners 70 1/2 or older

If you are at least 70 ½ years old and support First Presbyterian financially and own an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) – consider arranging with your IRA trustee to remit your church contribution(s) directly from your IRA account to the church. This direct giving arrangement is termed a "qualified charitable distribution or QCD", and if done properly and within certain annual dollar limits, can be treated as a non-taxable IRA withdrawal. IF you are also subject to a "Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)", any contributions sent directly from your IRA custodian to the church by December 31st will be counted as part of your RMD amount -thereby avoiding substantial tax penalties. The subject of whether one is required" to withdraw minimum amounts annually from IRA accounts when they reach 70½ or 72 years of age is more complex due to recent US legislative changes so please research the subject with a qualified accountant or tax advisor. Dec 31, 2022 Contribution deadline for Income Tax Deductions

For late December giving please remember that the IRS restricts current year contribution credits to those monies *actually* received in the church office or *post marked* prior to midnight of December 31st. If it is important that your contribution be included on your 2022 church giving record - please be *sure* that your contribution is either in the church office or is postmarked by the U. S. Post Office prior to midnight, Dec. 31st, 2022. For handwritten checks, the date of receipt at the church governs rather than the check date. For those who use an online bill pay service, be certain to specify that the bank mails your check in time to be postmarked by midnight December 31st.

Year-end giving Statements and Income Tax filing

Note that the 2017 Tax Jobs and Cuts Act is still in effect and raised the Standard Income Tax Deduction substantially. Available statistics indicate that as a result - only 10% to 15% of the taxpayer population are eligible to use itemized deductions (which also enhances the tax avoidance benefit of using Qualified Charitable gifts (discussed above) to realize income tax avoidance on your charitable gifts).

For those who expect to deduct charitable contributions on their 2022 tax return, please do not file before obtaining your church statement confirming your deductible charitable giving totals. In most instances, the church statement is *required in addition to* your cancelled checks or other records if the IRS were ever to challenge the amount you claimed as charitable giving. Statements for all givers will be available on-line for review, downloading and printing by January 31, 2023 via the church online Shelby Next Membership application. If you have a special need or prefer not to use the online resource, please call so that we can provide you with a mailed copy.

Giving Envelopes:

For those who have been using or have requested giving envelopes, they are re-ordered every six months, usually arriving early in December and June. They are placed in the Narthex in alphabetic order by last name. Please be sure to pick up your set and save us time and the cost of postage to mail them.
